







Ministerial responsibilities in the new Government around multiple needs

Following the 7 May 2015 election, a majority Conservative government has been formed. This briefing sets out the Ministerial positions that we think are likely to have the most significant responsibilities affecting people with multiple needs.

Department for Communities and Local Government



Rt Hon <u>Greg Clark</u> MP becomes Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government (with responsibility for Troubled Families)



Brandon Lewis MP is Minister of State for Housing and Planning



<u>Marcus Jones</u> MP becomes Minister for Local Government (with responsibility for homelessness and welfare reform)

Department of Health



The Rt Hon Jeremy Hunt MP is Secretary of State for Health



<u>Jane Ellison</u> MP is Parliamentary Under-Secretary for Public Health (with responsibility for health improvement around drugs and alcohol)



Rt Hon <u>Alistair Burt</u> MP becomes Minister of State for Community and Social Care (with responsibility for adult social care and mental health)

Ministry of Justice



Rt Hon <u>Michael Gove</u> MP becomes Lord Chancellor and Secretary of State for Justice



<u>Dominic Raab</u> MP becomes Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, Minister for Civil Liberties



<u>Andrew Selous</u> MP is Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, Minister for Prisons, Probation and Rehabilitation



<u>Caroline Dinenage</u> MP becomes Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Women and Equalities and Family Justice (with responsibility for mental health and female offenders)

Home Office



Rt Hon <u>Theresa May</u> MP is Secretary of State for the Home Department



Rt Hon Mike Penning MP is Minister for Policing, Crime and Criminal Justice (with responsibility for the UK drugs strategy, and also working with the Ministry of Justice)



<u>Karen Bradley</u> MP becomes Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, Minister for Preventing Abuse and Exploitation (with responsibility for mental health and violence against women and girls)

Department for Work and Pensions



Rt Hon <u>lain Duncan Smith</u> MP is Secretary of State for Work and Pensions



Priti Patel MP becomes Minister of State for Employment



<u>Justin Tomlinson</u> MP becomes Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Disabled People
