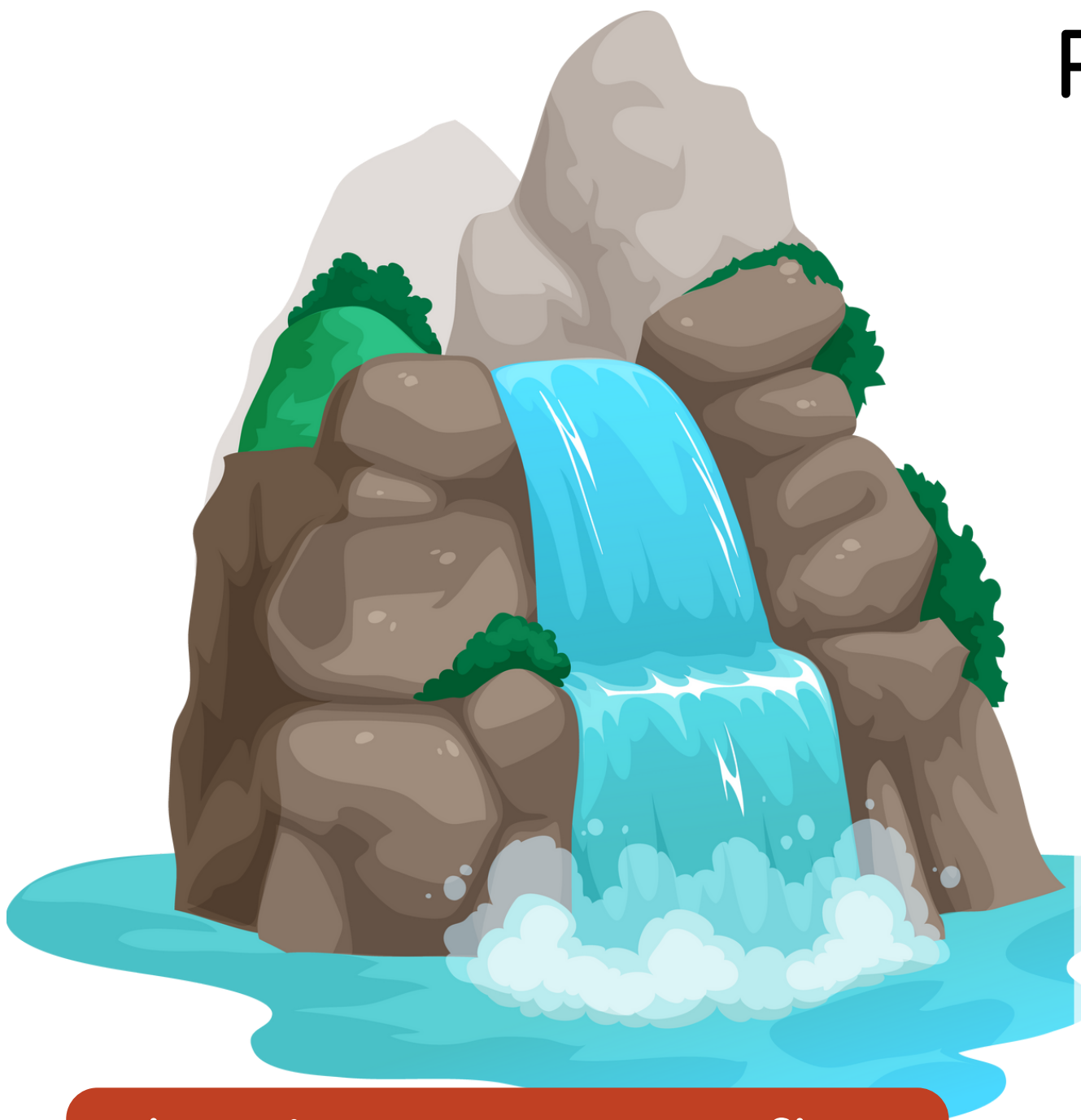


River of Coproduction



Build-up of headwaters

- 1- Acceptance of possibility**
All involved parties accept that real change is possible
- 2- Sharing of aspirations**
All involved parties share goals for the work
- 3- Combination of efforts**
Parties at all levels - lived and learnt experience, frontline and strategic - come together to reach these goals

4- Transformation of will into action

Change is facilitated in a practical way, through supporting the creation of working groups, engage lived experience voices, setting up remuneration policy, having active goals, and celebrating incremental successes

Continuous review and improvement is performed, there is a cyclical churn of attempt, review and adjustment
